- 1. The biggest challenge is creating a strong, united community that follows God's will.
- 2. It suggests the settlers were deeply religious and believed their colony should follow Christian values.
- 3. The writer worries that disagreements or selfish actions could cause the settlement to fail.
- 4. It shows settlers came for religious purposes and wanted to build a society based on their faith.

5. Example Answer:

This excerpt shows that life in the Massachusetts Bay Colony involved both hard physical labor and strict religious values. Settlers believed their community must honor God to succeed. Cooperation was necessary because survival was difficult in the new environment. It helps us understand how religion shaped laws and behavior in the colony.

6. Answers will vary but should include reasonable historical reasoning.
