Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Students will strengthen historical reasoning and recall by connecting major colonial and imperial events to their causes and outcomes.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For struggling readers, provide a simplified event list with key words highlighted (e.g., *India, rebellion, Britain*).
 - For advanced learners, ask students to justify each match in one sentence explaining cause and effect.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Conduct a "timeline race" where students arrange the events chronologically on the board.
 - Assign groups to research how one event influenced global power shifts or decolonization movements.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Students write a short reflection on which event they believe most clearly demonstrates the peak of European dominance.
 - Create a "map of imperial impact," marking which regions were affected by each event and how borders changed as a result.
