Two Worlds Apart Answer Key

1. Settlers farmed, built houses, traded goods, and worked in markets or on ships.
2. Indigenous people used the land for food and shelter without changing it; settlers cleared and owned it.
3. Both depended on nature for food, water, and materials for shelter.
4. Settlers viewed land as property to control, while Indigenous groups saw it as shared and sacred.
5. (Answers will vary, but should show reasoning tied to the passages.)

Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Students will compare cultural perspectives and daily life under colonialism, understanding how differing worldviews affected land use and community life.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Read the passages aloud for developing readers and discuss vocabulary such as *sacred*, *harbor*, and *balance*.
 - Challenge advanced students to write a short paragraph explaining how colonization changed both groups' lifestyles.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Role-play a conversation between a settler and an Indigenous person about how they view the land.
 - Use a large classroom map to locate where Indigenous villages and European settlements once existed.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Have students illustrate a "day in the life" for each community based on the readings.
 - Discuss modern examples of how different cultures view and protect nature today, connecting history to environmental stewardship.
