

Tool Intent Answer Key

A correct response will include the following elements:

- Both tools are used for **navigation** and help people understand where they are or where they should go.
- The compass shows **direction in the moment**, while the map shows **layout, location, and route planning**.
- Students should explain the different purposes clearly and support their ideas with details from the descriptions.

Sample Paragraph: A compass and a map are both tools that help people navigate, but they serve different purposes. A compass gives real time direction, helping someone know which way they are facing. A map helps a traveler understand where places are located and plan a route before they begin. While both tools are useful for navigation, the compass guides direction, and the map guides planning.

Teacher's Guide

- Introduce the idea of **purpose** by asking what a tool is meant to accomplish, not what it looks like.
- Encourage students to underline words that show use, such as *find their way*, *shows locations*, or *plan their path*.
- For differentiation:
 - Provide a sentence frame like "Both tools help with..., but Tool A is used for..., while Tool B is used for..."
 - Allow emerging writers to create a labeled chart before writing the paragraph.
- For engagement:
 - Show real compasses, printed maps, or digital map apps to build interest and understanding.
- For extension:
 - Have students choose two everyday tools from home and write their own purpose based comparison paragraph.
