Teacher's Guide

- Begin by reviewing common fraction-decimal equivalents such as $\frac{1}{2} = 0.5$, $\frac{1}{4} = 0.25$, $\frac{3}{4} = 0.75$, and $\frac{1}{5} = 0.2$.
- Encourage students to convert fractions to decimals before choosing a comparison symbol.
- Provide fraction strips, decimal grids, or number lines for students who benefit from visual models.
- Have students explain one comparison aloud to a partner to reinforce mathematical reasoning.
- Turn the worksheet into a quick class challenge by discussing strategies after each item.
- Extend learning by asking students to write four original fraction-decimal comparison problems and exchange them with a classmate.
