Reflection Questions: Sample Responses

- Personal feel: The first-person version shows Daniel's heartbeat, nerves, and self-talk, which makes it more personal and emotional.
- 2. **Extra details in third-person:** It shows how the crowd reacted and describes Daniel's actions from the outside, which the first-person didn't.
- 3. **Better imagination:** (Varies; sample: "I prefer the third-person version because I can see the whole scene, not just Daniel's thoughts.")
- 4. **Pitcher's perspective:** It might describe the pressure of throwing a perfect pitch, the strategy, or the surprise of hearing the ball crack against the bat.

Teacher Notes

- Emphasize to students that perspective changes both what details are included and how the reader feels about the event.
- Differentiation:
 - For younger or struggling learners, provide highlighted perspective words ("I," "my" vs. "he," "they").
 - For advanced learners, extend by asking them to rewrite the event from the crowd's perspective.
