## **Sample Responses**

- 1. **Difference:** Hamlet struggles inside himself (internal), while Odysseus struggles against nature (external).
- 2. **Revealed traits:** Hamlet is thoughtful, hesitant, and morally conflicted. Odysseus is brave, resourceful, and persistent.
- 3. **Relatable conflict:** (Varies; e.g., "I relate more to Hamlet's because I often face tough choices inside myself.")
- 4. **How conflicts create tension:** Internal conflicts make readers question what characters will choose; external conflicts provide action and danger. Together, they keep the story engaging.

## **Teacher Notes**

- Point out that both internal and external conflicts drive character development.
- Encourage students to notice cause and effect: Hamlet's internal conflict delays his action, while Odysseus's external conflict pushes him into immediate action.
- Differentiation:
  - Provide sentence starters for struggling learners ("Hamlet's conflict is internal because...").
  - Challenge advanced learners to connect these conflicts to a modern story or film.
