## Sample Rewritten Passage (answers will vary):

It was sunny, **because** we decided to go for a walk. We wanted to take the short path, **although** we chose the longer one. I carried water, **while** my friend carried snacks. We could stop at the playground, **whether** we kept walking to the lake **or not**. We were tired, **since** we sat under a tree to rest.

## **Breakdown of Changes:**

- 1. and  $\rightarrow$  because turns the sentence into cause/effect.
- 2. but  $\rightarrow$  although shows contrast with a subordinating conjunction.
- 3. and  $\rightarrow$  while emphasizes simultaneity instead of addition.
- 4. or  $\rightarrow$  whether...or not correlative pair replaces simple "or."
- 5. so  $\rightarrow$  since alternative cause-and-effect connector.

## **Teacher Notes:**

- Students may use different conjunctions, but the new sentences must remain logical and grammatically correct.
- This activity helps students see how tone and meaning shift depending on the type of conjunction chosen.
- Encourage advanced learners to experiment with multiple rewrites for a single sentence (e.g., "because," "since," "although") and discuss how subtle differences in meaning appear.
