1. **B) but** - shows contrast between wanting to go and the rain.
2. **A) or** - offers a choice of pizza or pasta.
3. **D) because** - explains the reason for staying home.
4. **C) but** - contrasts the dog's activity with the cat's.
5. **C) yet** - shows an unexpected result despite studying.
6. **D) Although** - shows contrast with the late time.
7. **B) since** - explains the reason for wearing a jacket.
8. **A) so** - shows cause and effect (missed bus → walked).
9. **D) unless** - sets a condition for going to the party.
10. **C) while** - shows two actions happening at the same time.

Teacher Notes:

- Remind students that some sentences *could* be grammatically correct with more than one conjunction, but the “best” choice is the one that fits both the grammar and the meaning.
- Encourage students to explain why wrong options don't fit; this deepens their understanding of how conjunctions connect ideas.
- For stronger learners, ask them to rewrite each sentence using a different conjunction and discuss how the meaning changes.
