Conjunctions in Categories Answer Key

Coordinating Conjunctions (FANBOYS):

• and, but, for, nor, or, so, yet

Subordinating Conjunctions:

although, because, since, unless, while, after, before, if, though

Correlative Conjunctions:

• both...and, either...or, neither...nor, not only...but also, whether...or

Teacher Notes:

- Remind students of the acronym FANBOYS to remember the seven coordinating conjunctions.
- Subordinating conjunctions connect a dependent clause to an independent clause. Examples: "I stayed home because it rained."
- Correlative conjunctions always work in pairs. Examples: "Both my sister and my brother came."
- Differentiation idea: Ask advanced students to highlight which type of relationship each conjunction shows (e.g., cause/effect, contrast, condition, choice).
