Transform the Tone Answer Key

Sample Responses (many possible answers; teacher should allow flexibility):

Sentence 1

- Positive tone: The restaurant was cozy, the food was affordable, and the staff was friendly.
- Negative tone: The restaurant was cramped, the food was cheap-looking, and the staff was chatty.

Sentence 2

- Positive tone: The student was self-assured, his essay was unique, and his ideas were inquisitive.
- Negative tone: The student was arrogant, his essay was weird, and his ideas were nosy.

Teacher Notes / Guide:

- Stress that answers may vary; what matters is whether students can justify the connotative shift.
- Encourage students to read both versions aloud. Tone often "feels" clearer when spoken.
- Extension idea: Have students write their own short paragraph with underlined neutral words, then swap with a partner to rewrite using connotation shifts.
- This activity helps students see how connotation influences tone and mood,
 which is critical in persuasive and creative writing.
