### Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Build civic literacy and reinforce key facts about the Constitution's origins, structure, and principles through a quiz format.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - *Younger or struggling readers:* Read questions aloud and discuss possible answers before selecting.
  - *Older or advanced students:* Require written explanations for at least three answers, connecting to real-world examples.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Turn the quiz into a "Constitution Quest" game show, with teams competing for points.
  - Display a timeline of key U.S. founding events to give visual context.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Have students create one new trivia question of their own to quiz classmates.
  - Encourage them to design a mini "Constitution Fact Poster" showing one article or amendment in action.
  - Pair with a short reading of the Preamble for choral recitation or creative performance.
