## Why Context Matters!

Part 1: Warm-Up - What's Context?

"Context" means giving background details that help an AI understand what you want. Example: Saying "Write a story" gives *no context*.

Saying "Write a short story about a brave mouse who saves his family from a cat" gives lots of context!
