

## Prompt Lab: What Went Wrong? Answer Key

1. Recycling is good because it makes the world better. You should do it because it's nice.

**Correct Answer:** B. Facts and details about *how* recycling helps

**Explanation:** The answer is vague and moral-sounding but lacks concrete examples or explanations (e.g., saving resources, reducing waste).

**Teaching Note:** Discuss how "details" give substance to ideas.

2. The Civil War was important because people fought. There were sides and something about freedom.

**Correct Answer:** A. Topic focus (what to explain)

**Explanation:** The AI doesn't know whether to explain *causes*, *effects*, or *key events*. The missing context is what specific aspect of the Civil War to address.

**Teaching Note:** Reinforce that prompts must tell the AI what *angle* to take.

3. Exercise is bad and good. Some people do it. Some people don't.

**Correct Answer:** A. The purpose (to inform, persuade, or entertain)

**Explanation:** The AI doesn't know whether to explain benefits, tell a story, or convince readers to exercise - so the tone is neutral and aimless.

**Teaching Note:** Help students see that *purpose* gives direction and attitude.

4. The water cycle is fun and cool. Rain happens. Water goes around somehow.

**Correct Answer:** C. Details and explanations

**Explanation:** The AI's language shows interest but lacks scientific clarity - it needs specifics (evaporation, condensation, precipitation).

**Teaching Note:** Good example of "too general to be useful."

5. Teamwork is when people work together. Everyone should do teamwork, but sometimes they don't.

**Correct Answer:** A. Examples or situations

**Explanation:** The response defines teamwork but never illustrates it. Missing context might be an example (e.g., sports, school project).

**Teaching Note:** Encourage adding examples to ground abstract ideas.

6. Dolphins are really awesome animals. They are amazing and special. They do cool things.

**Correct Answer:** C. Specific facts or examples

**Explanation:** The answer has energy but no substance - it needs real facts (e.g., echolocation, intelligence, habitat).

**Teaching Note:** "Cool words" are not content; substance comes from facts.
