Background

In 1775, tensions between the American colonies and Britain were escalating. Many colonists debated whether to remain loyal to the Crown or to seek independence. Writers and speakers of the time often published pamphlets to persuade their fellow colonists.

A Call to Courage

The time has come when silence is no longer an option. Our homes, our families, and our very freedom are threatened by those who claim authority an ocean away. Shall we remain obedient to a king who taxes us without consent and sends soldiers to guard our streets? Or shall we rise and claim the rights that belong to us by nature and by justice? For if we act together, history will remember us not as subjects, but as citizens.
