Sample Answers

- 1. **Biggest impact cause**: The record-breaking heatwave, because it set off all the other events (power outages, illnesses, and cooling centers).
- 2. **Do all effects have only one cause?** No. Example: Heat-related illnesses could be caused both by extreme temperatures and by lack of access to air conditioning.
- 3. Additional effect: Crops could be damaged by extreme heat, leading to food shortages or higher prices.

Teacher Guide/Notes

- **Skill Emphasis**: Helps students trace how one event triggers multiple consequences, a key element of critical comprehension.
- Encourage students to see that causes can have multiple effects and effects can have multiple causes.
- Extension: Have students create a **cause-and-effect chain diagram** that shows how the heatwave led to several different results branching out.
