1-2. Model Answers:

- Claim 1: "Destroyed nearly the entire city"
 - Reality Check: Destroyed 80% of the city → Exaggerated but partly true.
- Claim 2: "Left hundreds of thousands dead"
 - o **Reality Check:** Fewer than 10 recorded deaths \rightarrow *False.*
- Claim 3: "The fire raged for months"
 - Reality Check: Lasted 4 days → False.
- Claim 4: "London never truly recovered, remaining in ruins for decades"
 - Reality Check: Rebuilding began quickly and lasted several years →
 Exaggerated.
- 3. Why exaggeration? To make the disaster sound more dramatic and emphasize destruction.
- 4. **Understanding changes**: It shifts from thinking of the fire as a centuries-long tragedy to realizing it was devastating but recoverable.
- 5. **Importance**: It helps students learn not to accept text at face value and to develop **critical fact-checking skills**.

Teacher Guide/Notes

- Skill Emphasis: Students learn to distinguish between author claims and actual data, a vital skill in critical comprehension.
- Encourage them to label each claim clearly and support their judgment with evidence.
- Extension activity: Provide a modern article or social media claim about a current event, along with fact-checking data, and ask students to apply the same process.
