### Teacher's Guide

- Review each word aloud before starting
- Provide examples of the terms in context to support comprehension
- Encourage students to use complete sentences when writing their own definitions in the chart

### Differentiation

- Supply sentence starters or simplified definitions for emerging readers
- Allow oral matching first, then written recording
- For advanced learners: challenge them to use each vocabulary word in an original sentence about the American Revolution

### Engagement Strategies

- Create a word wall with these terms and visuals
- Play a quick "stand up if you hear a Patriot word" game during review
- Use role-play or skits to show the difference between a tyrant and a rebel

### Extension Opportunities

- Have students write a short paragraph using at least three vocabulary words
- Connect vocabulary to primary sources from the era, including colonial broadsides or speeches
- Encourage students to illustrate how colonists showed their rights and independence
