Case File Labels Answer Key

1. **D** - Declarative (It makes a factual statement about the sun setting).
2. **IP** - Imperative (It gives a command to hand the notebook).
3. **IG** - Interrogative (It asks a question about locking the door).
4. **E** - Exclamatory (It expresses strong emotion about the performance).
5. **D** - Declarative (It states what students are doing).
6. **IP** - Imperative (It directs someone to close the window).
7. **IG** - Interrogative (It asks about the field trip).
8. **E** - Exclamatory (It shows excitement/surprise about solving the puzzle).
9. **D** - Declarative (It provides factual information about the library).
10. **IP** - Imperative (It gives a command about bringing homework).

Teacher Notes / Guide:

- A quick trick: look at punctuation **and** sentence purpose.
 - **Declarative** ends with a period and informs.
 - **Interrogative** ends with a question mark.
 - **Imperative** often omits the subject "you" but gives an order.
 - **Exclamatory** ends with an exclamation mark and shows strong feeling.
- Extension idea: Have students rewrite two declarative sentences as interrogatives, imperatives, or exclamatories to deepen understanding.
