Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Offer a picture reference sheet of settings for students who need visual cues.
 - Read sensory details aloud for students who benefit from auditory support.
 - Reduce the list to five items for learners who require a shorter task.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Have students act out a sensory detail and let classmates guess the setting.
 - Invite students to explain why a detail fits a setting using one strong descriptive word.
 - Pair students to discuss which sense each detail represents.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Ask students to write their own sensory detail for one of the unused settings.
 - Challenge students to create a short descriptive paragraph that includes at least three senses.
 - Build a class chart of strong sensory phrases students generate during the activity.
