Teacher's Guide

Purpose: Help Grades 3 to 5 students strengthen descriptive writing by upgrading weak adjectives to stronger, more exact ones that create vivid settings.

- Model one sentence by highlighting weak adjectives and discussing possible replacements.
- Encourage students to think about senses and mood before choosing adjectives.
- Allow peer sharing so students can compare how different word choices affect tone.

Differentiation Tips

- Provide a word bank with vivid adjectives for students who need more support.
- Offer challenge words such as shimmering, towering, gritty, peaceful, eerie, or lush.
- Allow oral brainstorming for students who benefit from verbal processing.
