Teaching Tips

- Explain that themes are big ideas like freedom, friendship, and change that guide a story.
- Model how a line of dialogue can hint at a theme through metaphors, decisions, or character attitudes.
- Encourage students to avoid over-explaining. Subtlety strengthens themedriven writing.

Engagement Ideas

- Have students work in pairs to guess each other's chosen theme from their written dialogue.
- Use a "theme sort" station activity where students sort additional dialogue cards into the three categories.
- Allow groups to rewrite one dialogue to fit a different theme as a creative challenge.
