Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Offer sentence starters like *"A time I found light was when..."* or *"My light was..."* for students who need scaffolding.
 - Challenge advanced students to include figurative language (e.g., metaphors about light or hope).
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Dim the classroom lights and display a single glowing lamp or candle (real or digital) to set a reflective mood.
 - Play soft instrumental music while students write to encourage introspection.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Have students create a "Lantern of Light" by writing their reflection on paper lantern cutouts to hang around the room.
 - Encourage them to share their stories aloud or in pairs, focusing on how each person's "light" can inspire others.
