## Grammar Rescue Crew Answer Key

### Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Students identify and correct subject-verb agreement and tense errors with **do**, **does**, and **did** in a narrative context.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - Review pronouns and their matching verb forms before students begin.
  - Offer color-coded highlighting (one color for present, another for past) to aid visual learners.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Turn the task into a "Grammar ER" challenge where students "save" sentences on a whiteboard in teams.
  - Have students read the corrected paragraph dramatically, emphasizing the fixed verbs.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Ask students to write their own short paragraph about a school day using all three verb forms correctly.
  - Have them peer-edit each other's work, marking any new verb "emergencies" they spot.
