## Saturday Chores Answer Key

### Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Students identify and correct verb usage errors involving **do**, **does**, and **did**, reinforcing subject-verb agreement and tense recognition.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - Review subject pronouns (he, she, they, etc.) and pair each with the correct verb form before starting.
  - For struggling learners, provide a mini word bank of *do*, *does*, *did* for quick reference.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Turn the exercise into a "Grammar Detective Challenge," letting students find all the "clues" (errors) in a set time.
  - Encourage small group collaboration to rewrite the paragraph neatly on chart paper.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Have students write a short paragraph about their own weekend plans, using all three verbs correctly.
  - Ask them to highlight each *do/does/did* form in a different color to visualize proper usage.
