Guidelines for Evaluation

Strong responses should include:

- First-person perspective: Uses "I" to speak as Earth.
- **Emotional tone**: Expresses clear feelings like sadness, hope, pride, or frustration.
- Cause and effect awareness: Shows understanding of how human actions impact nature.
- Creative expression: Includes vivid imagery (e.g., "My oceans ache," "My forests whisper for help").
- Message to humanity: Ends with a call for care, respect, or renewal.

Teacher's Guide

- Begin with a short class brainstorm: "If Earth could talk, what would it say?" Write ideas on the board.
- Encourage varied tones-some students may write seriously, others humorously.

Differentiation Strategies:

- **Grades 3-5**: Allow shorter responses with sentence starters (e.g., "I feel proud when...").
- Grades 6-8: Expect more complex cause-effect thinking and figurative language.
- Grades 9-12: Ask students to turn their story into a speech or poem from Earth's perspective.

Engagement & Extension Ideas:

- Turn the writings into a "Voices of Earth" class anthology for Earth Day display.
- Connect with art: students can illustrate "how Earth feels" beside their writing.
