Sample improved version:

Teacher's Guide

- Remind students that repeated words can make writing sound plain, and specific vocabulary adds clarity.
- Have students underline all repeated or weak terms before choosing word bank replacements.
- Encourage students to read their revised paragraph aloud to check fluency and tone.
- Offer sentence frames for support: The ___ playground..., A ___ slide..., Kids ran across the ___ field....
- For students who need extra help, allow them to choose just three replacements at first.
- For advanced students, have them add an extra descriptive sentence using at least one more word bank term.
- Extension idea: Let students create their own mini word bank to revise a passage written by a partner.
