Teacher's Guide

- Help students identify why the bolded words are weak. Ask what they fail to show or clarify.
- Encourage students to use sensory language such as what they see, hear, smell, or feel.
- Provide a mini word bank for students who struggle with vocabulary. For example: vibrant, towering, fragrant, gentle, peaceful.
- Allow students to orally brainstorm before writing if additional support is needed.
- For grades 3 to 5, model revising one weak sentence first.
- For grades 6 to 8, push students to focus on coherence and flow between ideas.
- For grades 9 to 12, require precision and thematic consistency, not just more adjectives.
- Extension idea: Have students create their own weak paragraph and trade with a partner to revise.
