Fable Scene Enhancer Answer Key

Teacher sample sensory additions may include:

Scene 1: Students might add imagery such as the crisp crunch of fallen leaves under the fox's paws, the sweet smell of ripe apples drifting through the orchard, or the cool morning air brushing against its fur.

Scene 2: Students might add sounds like the rooster's sharp call, the rustling of animals in the barn, the warm glow of the rising sun, or the faint smell of hay in the yard.

Scene 3: Students might add the cool touch of the river mist, the soft buzzing of insects, the lion's reflection rippling in the clear water, or the earthy scent of the riverbank.

(Any answer that adds sensory details that clearly enhance imagery counts as correct.)

Teacher's Guide

- Introduce or review the five senses so students understand the types of details they can add.
- Model adding specific details instead of general ones. For example, replace "nice smell" with "sweet smell of fresh hay."
- Encourage students to underline the sensory details they add for selfchecking.
- For students who need support, provide a mini sensory word bank such as: crisp, sweet, rustling, warm, gritty, sharp, earthy, cool, dim, fragrant.
- For higher grades, require students to add details that also support a mood or tone.
- Allow students to partner share before writing to generate ideas.
- Extension idea: Have students choose a fable scene of their own and create a sensory detail makeover challenge for a classmate.
