Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For support, provide sentence stems with blanks for **either** or **neither** and review examples before starting.
 - For advanced learners, challenge them to create their own dialogue lines using the determiners correctly.
- **Engagement Idea:** Let pairs act out rewritten conversations to practice natural speech flow using the correct words.
- **Extension Activity:** Ask students to write a short, four-line dialogue that includes **either** and **neither** naturally, then exchange with a partner for editing and feedback.
