Sample Responses

1. Entry: "Hey, that project looks cool! Can I help paint?"
Exit: "This was fun-thanks for letting me help. I need to go now."
2. Entry: "Hi, I saw that movie too! Can I join your conversation?"
Exit: "That was a great chat. I have to head out, see you later."
3. Entry: "Would it be okay if I joined your study group?"
Exit: "Thanks for studying with me. I'll review the rest tonight."
4. Entry: "This game looks fun! Mind if I play a round?"
Exit: "That was great-thanks for the game. I have to go now."
5. Entry: "Hey everyone, can I sit here with you?"
Exit: "This was awesome! I have to run to class, see you later."

Teacher's Guide

- **Skill Focus:** Developing **social communication**, **self-regulation**, and **situational awareness** when joining and leaving group interactions.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Provide sentence frames for students needing extra language structure ("Can I join...?" "Thanks for letting me...")
 - Allow role-playing or visual cue cards for nonverbal learners.
 - Use modeling and guided practice for students with limited social confidence.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Pair students to act out their entry and exit scripts in classroom role-plays.
 - Use real-life examples (clubs, study sessions, lunch groups) to practice natural interactions.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Have students write short dialogues that include both entry and exit phrases.
 - Encourage students to reflect on how respectful communication builds better group relationships.
