Sample Responses

- **Teaching Tips:**

- **Differentiation Strategies:**

- For **younger learners (Grades 3-4)**: discuss the difference between being "honest" and being "kind." Provide a few sample replacements as a guide.
- For **older learners (Grades 5-6)**: encourage students to justify their word choices or brainstorm multiple polite alternatives.
- For **advanced students**: challenge them to identify euphemisms used in news stories or public announcements.
