2. "The administration is implementing a targeted tax adjustment to ensure fairness in our economic system."
3. "In response to recent job market shifts, several agencies will undergo staff realignment in the coming months."
4. "Some individuals have been temporarily relocated as part of our national security efforts."
5. "The government is working on an initiative to address collateral damage that occurred during operations abroad."
