Teacher's Guide

• **Skill Focus:** Encourages mastery of how *few*, *a few*, and *the few* convey subtle differences in tone, quantity, and specificity within connected writing.

Differentiation Tips:

- Provide examples of tone before writing (e.g., "few" = negative, "a few" = hopeful, "the few" = selective or proud).
- Allow struggling writers to brainstorm sentences separately before combining them.

• Engagement Ideas:

- Have students swap paragraphs and identify each determiner's tone.
- Host a "word detective" challenge where peers explain why a determiner fits its sentence.

Extension Activities:

- Ask advanced students to revise their paragraph to change its overall tone by switching determiners.
- Encourage connections to literature, news, or personal experiences that show scarcity or selectiveness in real-world writing.
