Al will do what you tell it to, but if your instructions are too vague, you'll probably get a confusing or unhelpful answer. That's where you come in-you're the investigator. Your job is to examine each "bad prompt," figure out what makes it unclear or sloppy, and then rewrite it so it's sharp, specific, and easy to follow. Think like a detective: spot the ambiguity, identify the problem, and clean it up.
