Exhibit A: The Casual Slip-Up

Bad Prompt: “Yo, give me the dirt on how the Civil War went down, keep it short and chill.”

Target Audience: A history teacher.

Improved Rewrite:

“Please provide a clear summary of the main events of the Civil War in a concise way suitable for a classroom discussion.”

Exhibit B: The Harsh Order

Bad Prompt: “Explain to me how plants eat sunlight RIGHT NOW and don't make it boring.”

Target Audience: An elementary school student.

Improved Rewrite:

“Can you explain how plants use sunlight to make food in a fun and simple way that a young student could understand?”

Exhibit C: The Robotic Request

Bad Prompt: “Provide a comprehensive overview of leisure activities conducted by youth demographics within contemporary culture.”

Target Audience: A middle school audience.

Improved Rewrite:

“Can you explain some of the most popular hobbies and activities that kids and teens enjoy today, using easy-to-understand language?”

Exhibit D: The Mixed-Up Mood

Bad Prompt: “Hey dude, hook me up with some quick tips on writing a professional email.”

Target Audience: A business professional.

Improved Rewrite:

“Please give me some clear and practical tips on how to write a professional email that makes a good impression in a workplace setting.”
