## Wandering Questions

Big, vague questions are tricky-like asking, *"Tell me everything about history!"* That's too much! A focused question, though, zooms in and makes the answer clear, like: *"Summarize the main causes of the American Civil War in under 200 words."*

In this activity, you'll practice turning "too broad" questions into sharper, more useful ones. Just read the broad question, then rewrite it into a focused version that actually points to a clear answer. Try to make it specific, and even set limits (like word count, time period, or detail).
