Teacher's Guide

- **Skill Focus:** Creative writing, **historical summarization**, and **concise expression** through journalism-style language.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For younger or developing students, model how to shorten long ideas into headline-style phrases.
 - For older students, encourage historical accuracy and creative use of tone or emotion.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Have a "Flag Day Newsroom" bulletin board where students post their headlines.
 - Turn the worksheet into a mock front page layout activity with drawings or typed headlines.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Ask students to write a short news article (1-2 paragraphs) under one of their headlines.
 - Link to civic literacy: discuss how headlines influence how people understand national events and symbols.
