1. D - Listen and make eye contact
2. C - Give them a few feet of space and wait until they are done
3. A - Stand nearby, listen for a pause, and say hello
4. B - Give them space and offer to talk when they are ready
5. C - Wait your turn and share your thoughts calmly
6. D - Wait for your turn and then explain clearly
7. A - Smile, answer politely, and keep your distance
8. B - Offer to help with a task and thank them for their effort

Teacher's Guide:

- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Read each scenario aloud and discuss possible answers before students choose one.
 - Provide visual cues or short role-play examples to help students understand body language and tone.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn the quiz into a "Social Skills Challenge" where small groups discuss why each correct answer is appropriate.
