Sample Responses

Teacher's Guide

• **Skill Focus:** Develops deeper understanding of **for** (duration) and **since** (starting point) through creative storytelling and temporal awareness. Encourages fluency, precision, and stylistic control in narrative writing.

• Differentiation Tips:

- o Offer a word bank of time expressions (e.g., "for two hours," "since last winter," "for ages") for learners who need extra support.
- o Allow students to brainstorm their time markers before writing to organize their ideas.

Engagement Ideas:

- o Invite volunteers to read their stories aloud while the class identifies all uses of **for** and **since**.
- Turn the activity into a "Time Story Slam" where students share and vote on the most creative or emotional piece.

• Extension Activities:

- Have advanced students merge both time types in one narrative, using for and since correctly within a single timeline.
- Encourage students to revise their stories for tone and structure, transforming them into polished short essays.
