Teacher's Guide

- Review the pattern: divide by the denominator, then multiply by the numerator.
- Encourage students to look for patterns across each row as the whole numbers increase.
- Provide grid paper or scratch paper for students who need help organizing their work.
- Have students compare answers with a partner and explain how they found one value in each table.
- Ask students to predict the next whole number and its matching fraction value before calculating.
- Extend the lesson by having students create a new fraction table for a classmate using a different fraction such as $\frac{3}{5}$ or $\frac{7}{8}$.
