Teacher's Guide

- Review how to find a fraction of a whole number before students begin ordering.
- Encourage students to solve every expression first, then compare the results.
- Provide a number line for students who need support comparing values.
- Have students explain why two values belong in a particular position, especially when values are equal.
- Challenge early finishers to create a set of four fraction-of-a-number expressions for a partner to order.
- Reinforce that ordering is based on the computed values, not the sizes of the fractions alone.
