Teacher's Guide

- Review the two-step process: divide the whole number by the denominator, then multiply by the numerator.
- Encourage students to write the division step before multiplying to reinforce the procedure.
- Provide multiplication charts or fact tables for students who need computation support.
- Challenge advanced students to write the matching multiplication equation for each problem, such as $\frac{3}{4} \times 20 = 15$.
- Have students compare answers with a partner and explain how they solved one problem aloud.
- Extend learning by asking students to create three new "find the fraction of a number" problems for a classmate to solve.
