Summing the Struggle Answer Key

(Sample Summaries & Words)

These are **sample responses** to guide teachers. Students' answers will vary but should remain concise and accurate.

Chapter 1

- Summary: Douglass describes his birthplace, his uncertain age, and the painful separation from his mother. He introduces the cruel reality of slavery by explaining how family ties were deliberately broken.
- One Word: *Separation*
- Why this word? The chapter highlights forced separation from family as one of slavery's cruelties.

Chapter 2

- Summary: Douglass explains the harsh conditions on Colonel Lloyd's plantation. Slaves endured long work hours, severe punishment, and little food.
- One Word: *Oppression*
- Why this word? The description focuses on how slavery crushed both body and spirit.

Chapter 3

- Summary: Douglass details the strict surveillance and brutal punishments under Colonel Lloyd, including the dangers of speaking honestly. Slaves were forced to praise their masters to avoid punishment.
- One Word: *Fear*
- Why this word? The chapter emphasizes the climate of fear created to control enslaved people.
