Visual Predictions Answer Key

(Answers will vary. Below are examples of correct tense use.)

1. By the end of class, the students **will have been studying** their lessons.
2. By the time they reach the finish line, the runner **will have been running** for hours.
3. By the time their flight is called, the family **will have been waiting** in the airport.
4. By the end of the year, the workers **will have been constructing** the skyscraper for many months.

Teacher Notes / Guide

- **Purpose:** This worksheet helps students **connect visuals to grammar** by using imagination or real-life scenarios. It makes grammar practice more engaging.
- **Key Teaching Tip:** Before writing, have students **identify the time marker** in each prompt (e.g., *by midnight*, *by the end of class*). This keeps the tense anchored in the future.
- **Common Error:** Students may drop "been" (*will have studying* - wrong). Model one example first: "*By midnight, they will have been talking.*"
- **Extension Idea:** Give students real pictures (magazine cutouts, slides, or whiteboard sketches) and ask them to create **original future perfect continuous sentences** for each. This makes the drill open-ended and creative.
