Continuous Queries Answer Key

1. Will she have been working at the café for six months by next Friday?
2. Will they have been traveling for ten hours by the time we meet them?
3. Will he have been living in London for three years by then?
4. Will we have been waiting for the bus for half an hour?
5. Will I have been studying all night for the exam?
6. Will my parents have been running their own shop for a decade by next year?
7. Will she have been practicing piano for three hours when the lesson ends?
8. Will we have been playing soccer since the morning?
9. Will scientists have been working on this project for twenty years by 2030?
10. Will the children have been reading quietly for an hour by the time class finishes?

Teacher Notes / Guide

- **Why this activity works:** Students often forget how to **invert the subject and auxiliary verbs** when forming questions in compound tenses. This worksheet trains them to correctly structure “**Will + subject + have been + -ing verb.**”
- **Teaching Tip:** Encourage students to highlight or underline the **time marker** (e.g., *by next Friday*, *since the morning*, *by 2030*). This helps anchor the action in the future, reinforcing the correct tense use.
- **Common Error Alert:** Many students mistakenly drop “been” or rearrange the auxiliary verbs. Model one example on the board before assigning independent practice.
- **Extension Idea:** After forming the questions, students can role-play **mini-interviews** with classmates about their future lives (e.g., “*Will you have been studying at this school for three years by next summer?*”). This makes the activity interactive and fun.
