## **Teacher Notes / Guide**

- Why this activity works: Students don't just form the tense mechanically—
  they see it in a realistic passage and must interpret its meaning. This builds
  deeper understanding of how the tense shows duration leading up to a
  future point.
- **Teaching Tip:** Before students answer, ask them to **underline all verbs** in the future perfect continuous tense. This helps visually separate the structure from other tenses.
- **Common Struggle:** Learners often confuse future perfect with future perfect continuous. Remind them:
  - Future Perfect → completion (will have done)
  - Future Perfect Continuous → ongoing action up to that point (will have been doing)
- Extension Idea: Have students write a mini-passage about themselves (e.g., "By the end of this school year, I will have been...") and exchange with a partner to create comprehension questions.
