## Error-Free Future Answer Key

1. By the time you arrive, I will have cooked dinner.
2. She will have written the essay before Friday.
3. They will have completed the project by tomorrow morning.
4. At this time next year, we will have finished the new house.
5. He will have seen the movie twice before it leaves theaters.
6. You will have eaten lunch by the time the bell rings.
7. The students will have studied hard before the exam starts.
8. By midnight, the chef will have prepared fifty desserts.
9. Our family will have visited Paris three times by then.
10. I will have completed all the levels in the game by tonight.

### Teacher Notes:

- This activity reinforces that the **future perfect tense** always uses “**will have**” + **past participle**.
- Many errors come from confusing **simple future** with **future perfect**, or from mixing forms (*will has* instead of *will have*).
- Encourage students to underline the **time expression** (“by the time...,” “before Friday,” “by tomorrow”) since these signal the **future perfect tense**.
- Extension: Have students write **two new sentences with intentional errors** and swap with a partner for correction.
