Teacher's Guide

- Read each text section aloud as a class first
- Let students highlight key clues in phrases like "honor" or "freedom"

Differentiation

- For English learners, pre-teach vocabulary such as "nation," "honor," and "sacrifice"
- Allow advanced students to justify each choice using one sentence of evidence

Engagement Ideas

- Create a timeline mural with sections placed in the correct order
- Hold a short reflection circle: Why do we still remember this speech today?

Extension

- Students rewrite one section in their own words in a short journal response
