Teacher's Guide

- **Skill focus:**
 - Helps students check **word meaning** in simple context sentences.
 - Builds early comprehension and vocabulary accuracy.
 - Encourages students to think about what makes sense in real life.
- **Before the activity:**
 - Review the idea that a word must make sense in the sentence.
 - Give one example on the board, such as: "The **dog** baked a cake."
Ask: Does that make sense?
- **During the activity (differentiation and support):**
 - Allow students to act out or visualize the sentence to decide if it is realistic.
 - Highlight the **bold word** to draw attention to meaning.
 - Pair students so they can discuss YES or NO together before circling.
- **Engagement tips:**
 - Students love silly sentences. Encourage laughter when a word is used the wrong way, then ask why it does not make sense.
